HEALTH FORM

Each camper must have a completed health form. A physical examination must be performed by a doctor within 24 months of arrival at **Camp War Eagle**. The Health Form should be returned to **Camp War Eagle** by the deadline on your acceptance letter. Campers will meet a nurse upon arrival at camp and leave any medication with the nurse. **ALL HEALTH FORMS MUST BE SIGNED BY A PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN (NO EXCEPTIONS).**

OPENING & CLOSING DAY

On Opening Day (Sunday), the **Camp War Eagle** gates will open at 1:00 p.m. **No camper will be admitted prior to 1:00 p.m.** Check-in will be open until approximately 3:00 p.m. On Closing Day (Saturday), the camp gates will open at 8:30 a.m. The Closing Ceremony begins at 10:00 a.m. and will end at 10:45 a.m.

HOW TO REACH CAMP WAR EAGLE

Camp War Eagle is located east of Rogers, Arkansas off of Highway 12. Campers may get to camp by personal vehicle or may meet buses that leave from Bentonville, Fayetteville, Rogers and Springdale. Because of limited parking availability and congestion caused by the high volume of traffic, **Camp War Eagle** recommends that families utilize the **free** bus transportation provided.

Please make certain that your Travel Card is returned in a timely fashion, so that a correct record of each camper's travel plans is on file at **Camp War Eagle**. **If your camper's travel arrangements change, Camp War Eagle must be notified in writing.**

Driving Directions to Camp War Eagle (Note: Internet directions provided by Mapquest and GoogleMaps are not correct!)

From Rogers (approx 45 minutes) - Take Hwy 12 east out of Rogers. Go 4.5 miles beyond the Beaver Lake Bridge. Turn right on Piney Rd. Go 2 miles to the stop sign next to the church. Go left/straight through the stop sign onto Railroad Cut Road and take the first left onto Old Piney Store Rd. Stay on Old Piney Store Road for 1 mile. Turn right onto Ingram Place Rd and go 5 miles. Turn left at the **Camp War Eagle** sign.

From Springdale (approx 1 hour) - Take Hwy 412 east for 14.4 miles to Hwy 303 N. Turn left onto Hwy 303 N. Follow 303 about 9.5 miles to Hwy 12. (You will go across the bridge at the War Eagle Mill.) Turn left onto Hwy 12 and proceed 1.75 miles to Piney Road. Turn left on Piney Rd. Go 2 miles to the stop sign next to the church. Go left/straight through the stop sign onto Railroad Cut Road and take the first left onto Old Piney Store Rd. Stay on Old Piney Store Road for 1 mile. Turn right onto Ingram Place Rd and go 5 miles. Turn left at the **Camp War Eagle** sign.

VISITATION

To avoid disturbing the **Camp War Eagle** program and for safety and security reasons, we ask that family and friends **NOT** visit during camp until Closing Day. Campers are not allowed to come and go during a camp session. Campers are also not permitted to arrive to a session late or leave while camp is in session.

TELEPHONE USE

In order that the camp routine is not disturbed, **campers are not allowed to receive or make telephone calls** except in the event of a **medical emergency**. Parents should feel free to contact the Camp Director if they have a need to discuss something relating to their child. **Cell phones may not be brought to Camp War Eagle.**

CAMP STORE

The **Camp War Eagle** Store is open on Opening and Closing Day. Cash and checks are only accepted on these days. **Camp War Eagle** does not accept Credit or Debit cards and Camper Store Accounts are not available for use on Opening and Closing Day.

Each camper has the option to deposit money into a store account. The store account operates similar to a checking account and is available for each camper to use during their session (excluding Opening and Closing Day). **ALL MONEY MUST BE SENT PRIOR TO CAMP OR BE TURNED IN TO THE OFFICE ON OPENING DAY. NO MONEY IS ALLOWED TO BE KEPT IN THE CABINS.** Each camper is allowed one free snack and drink item from our camp store during each Mish Mash, so extra money may only be needed at camp for personal items such as stamps, camp t-shirts, extra craft items, etc. **Camp War Eagle** recommends a \$20.00 - \$50.00 deposit.

Unused balances in excess of \$5 will be refunded to you approximately 2-4 weeks after the camp session. Any unused balance less than \$5 will be donated to the **Camp War Eagle Needs Fund** unless otherwise directed in writing.

WHAT TO BRING

Listed are items that are necessary for **Camp War Eagle**. Please note that NO item is mandatory. If you are unable to supply an item due to your financial situation, **Camp War Eagle** can provide any essential items needed during the camp session. In choosing your camper's clothing, keep in mind that he or she will be involved in energetic activities daily and comfort and freedom of movement are most important. Laundry service is provided once during each 14 day session. Laundry will also be done for children unable to provide enough clothing for the session on an as-needed basis.

***NOTE:** All profane shirts, including shirts that advertise alcohol or tobacco products, and other inappropriate shirts are not allowed. Teenaged girls must not bring backless shirts. Nor should they bring halter-tops or tank tops that are too low cut, too tight or expose the midriff.

Camp War Eagle provides all necessary equipment for activities; therefore, it is not necessary to bring ball gloves, tennis racquets, skateboards, bikes, etc. Expensive cameras should not be brought. **Radios, iPods, CD players, MP3 players, cell phones, laptops, video games, and other similar items are NOT ALLOWED. IF THESE ITEMS ARE BROUGHT TO CAMP, THEY WILL BE CONFISCATED AND HELD IN THE OFFICE UNTIL CLOSING DAY. ALSO, FIREWORKS, GUNS, AMMUNITION AND KNIVES ARE NOT ALLOWED. FOOD, GUM OR CANDY MUST NOT BE SENT OR BROUGHT TO CAMP.** Pets or animals of any kind may not be brought to Camp. In order to assure safety and security, **Camp War Eagle** reserves the right to search all personal belongings at any time.

SPECIAL EVENT CLOTHING (OPTIONAL): Campers are encouraged to "Dress" for our nightly Special Events. Suggestions for Special Event Clothing are listed below. (Nothing fancy or extravagant is required or necessary for any of the events listed below.)

1. "Western Night" Outfit
2. Fatigue shirt or camouflage for "Mission Impossible"
3. Red, White and/or Blue Clothes for "Red White and Blue Day"
4. Holiday attire for "Reindeer Games"
5. "Hip" clothes for "Planet EAGLE"
6. Nautical, bright or beachwear for "Water World"
7. Favorite creative costume for "Masquerade Madness" (14 day sessions only)
8. Your choice of attire from your favorite decade, 50's to futuristic, for "Back to the Future" (14 day sessions only)
9. Sportswear and/or swimwear for "Pump It Up" (14 day sessions only)
10. Pink, ultra girly clothing for "Girl's Night Out" - No special clothing for "Guy's Night Out" (14 day sessions only)
